Plaka & Pollonia Villages

Plaka Village is the capital town of Milos. It is located north of the Gulf of Milos and covers the sides of a hill, bordering the villages of Plakes, Triovasalos, Pera Triovasalos and Tripiti. Plaka is one of the most picturesque places to visit on the island, with traditional Cycladic architecture. Its narrow alleys are full of whitewashed houses with brightly painted windows and balconies that are decorated with bougainvillea flowers.

Pollonia Village in Milos is the island's second biggest settlement. Located on the northeastern part of the island, it is a charming fishing village built around an inlet that features a small harbor. Full of whitewashed houses along the coastline, Pollonia preserves its authentic style of Cycladic architecture and is known as one of the most beautiful seaside villages in Milos. The area boasts a few sights worth visiting, some fun things to do and a lovely beach.

The famous Sarakiniko Bay

For those of you who have always harboured a wish to travel to the moon (and maybe do a little sunbathing whilst you're there), your answer lies on the island of Milos. Sarakiniko is Greece's lunar landscape: an extraordinary scene of chalk-white rock, smoothed and shaped by time, and all the more dramatic for its contrast against the azure sea beyond. Named after the Saracen pirates who once used it as a hideout, Sarakiniko Bay is coastline wilderness at its most alluring.

There's a good chance you'll have seen Sarakiniko, even if you haven't yet visited. It's been the setting for countless new-season fashion photo shoots, with the contours and colours of the eroded volcanic ash, sandstone and pumice stone serving as a unique backdrop. So before settling down on the narrow, peninsula-sheltered sandy beach, it's worth exploring. There's even a network of abandoned mines and caves.
