Plaka & Pollonia Villages

Plaka Village

Plaka is the **capital of Milos**, located on a hill north of the Gulf of Milos, next to the villages of Plakes, Triovasalos, Pera Triovasalos, and Tripiti. It is one of the prettiest places on the island, known for its traditional Cycladic style. Walking through its narrow streets, you'll see white houses with colorful windows and balconies decorated with bougainvillea flowers.

Pollonia Village

Pollonia, the second-largest village in Milos, is on the island's northeast coast. It is a peaceful fishing village built around a small harbor. Along the shore, whitewashed houses keep the traditional Cycladic charm. Pollonia is known for its relaxing atmosphere, a nice beach, and a few places worth visiting.

The famous Sarakiniko Bay

One of the most iconic and photographed spots in Milos, is a must-visit for its otherworldly beauty. Located on the island's north coast, this breathtaking landscape was formed by centuries of volcanic activity and relentless erosion from the wind and sea. The result is a series of smooth, chalk-white rock formations that resemble a lunar surface, creating a stark contrast with the deep blue waters of the Aegean Sea.

The area takes its name from Saracen pirates, who once used the bay as a strategic hideout. You can wander along the moon-like terrain, discovering natural rock bridges, sea caves, and crevices carved out by the elements. Despite the lack of shade, the allure of the scenery and the inviting sea make it a favorite spot for swimming and sunbathing. A narrow strip of sand at the end of the bay offers a small, sheltered beach ideal for relaxing after exploring.

Beyond its natural beauty, Sarakiniko holds remnants of Milos' mining history—abandoned tunnels and caves hint at the island's rich geological past
